### Forest Glen Sports Association Quarterly Board Meeting April 15, 2023

The meeting was called to order by President, Mickey Gisriel. Those in attendance were Mickey and Delores Gisriel, Cheryl Kramp, Hat Hrack, Sheri Reichert, and Rich and Nancy Hess.

The minutes from the January meeting were read. It was moved and seconded to accept the minutes as read.

# **Treasurers Report:**

The Treasurer's report was distributed. We have \$20,000 in the water account. Rich suggested that since we have \$53,000 in our bank account, we put another \$10,000 into the water account. We will be waiting to do this until the HOA pays the loan due to the USDA which is coming up.

# Water Report:

Cheryl gave the water report. She attended a conference following our fire evacuation which was concerned with the contamination of water systems by fire suppression chemicals. Everyone has to test for the level in their water system. Cheryl will have water samples taken for preliminary testing. There is a company that will do this at no charge and Cheryl says we should have this done as the requirements are very stringent. It will not cost the HOA any money for the testing. This is a mandatory requirement.

Cheryl said that the water line will be put in at Bob Cain's within the next two weeks.

We have the lead copper treatment installed and Cheryl says that we have one more quarterly report to do.

## **Committee Reports:**

There are currently no committees. Bylaws committee has been suspended.

### Under old business:

Mickey brought the problem of dogs running loose and threatening people walking. Rich said he thought it was more effective for the residents that were affected to call animal control than it was for the HOA to try to handle it.

Rich said that we did not stock fish in the pond because they doubled our price without letting us know. So he cancelled it for this year and we will look at it for next year. It was moved and seconded that we table the fish stocking until next spring.

### Under new business:

With the recent evacuations we had, Rich suggested that all residents consider more mitigation. Mitigation helps with insurance costs.

Maintenance projects for this year include building steps from the picnic table to the lake and repair the stairs from the clubhouse to the picnic area. Also painting the shed to match the clubhouse. Exercising the water valves. Ballots have been sent out and must be returned by May 5, 2023.
